This figure has hardly passed out of view when another one appears - Carol Knutson, the wife of the smallest midget in the United States.


The mistre-appears, again rises, and reveals Beatrica Seim, the fashion model of Paris.


As none of the boys on the team are graduating this year, we look forward to an even more successful season next year.

The group singsin three parts, soprano, second soprano, and alto.


Regular meetings were held on Tuesday

In order to earn money we sold greeting cards, that is, Christmas, Birthday, and sympethy cards. Together with the Boy Scouts, we Sponsored a carnival.


The committee women for our troop are Mrs. G. H. Anderson-Chairman, Mrs. C. E. Kelsven, and


